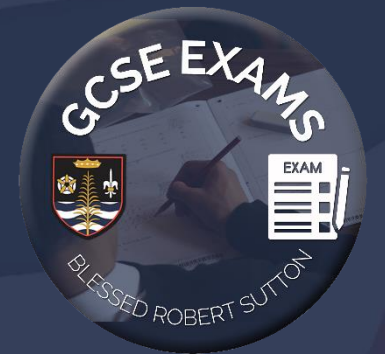

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Literature Paper 1

- **‘Shakespeare’ – 30 marks + 4 SPAG**
- **‘A Christmas Carol’- 30 marks**

Both extract based, and then you write about the rest of the text

40% *of your whole Literature Grade*

English Literature Paper 2

2.15hr 60% of GCSE

1 x essay on 'Animal Farm' or 'Blood Brothers' (30 marks)

1 x Comparative essay from the Power and Conflict Poetry anthology (30 marks)

1 x Unseen Poetry essay (24 marks)

1 x Comparative unseen Poetry essay (8 marks)



GCSE English Literature

These are **closed book exams** – you don't get a copy of the texts, so you need to learn key events and quotations

As well as a revision calendar, these strategies can also be hugely helpful

- *Talk about the texts studied*
- *Get visual: create timelines, graphs and charts*
- *Create quotation explosions, flashcards, mind maps*
- *Workbooks*
- *YouTube videos and downloading audio: make notes*
- *Re-read the texts, but don't passively read: make notes*
- *Write essays and redo past essays*
