Component 2 Health and social care services and values (coursework based)

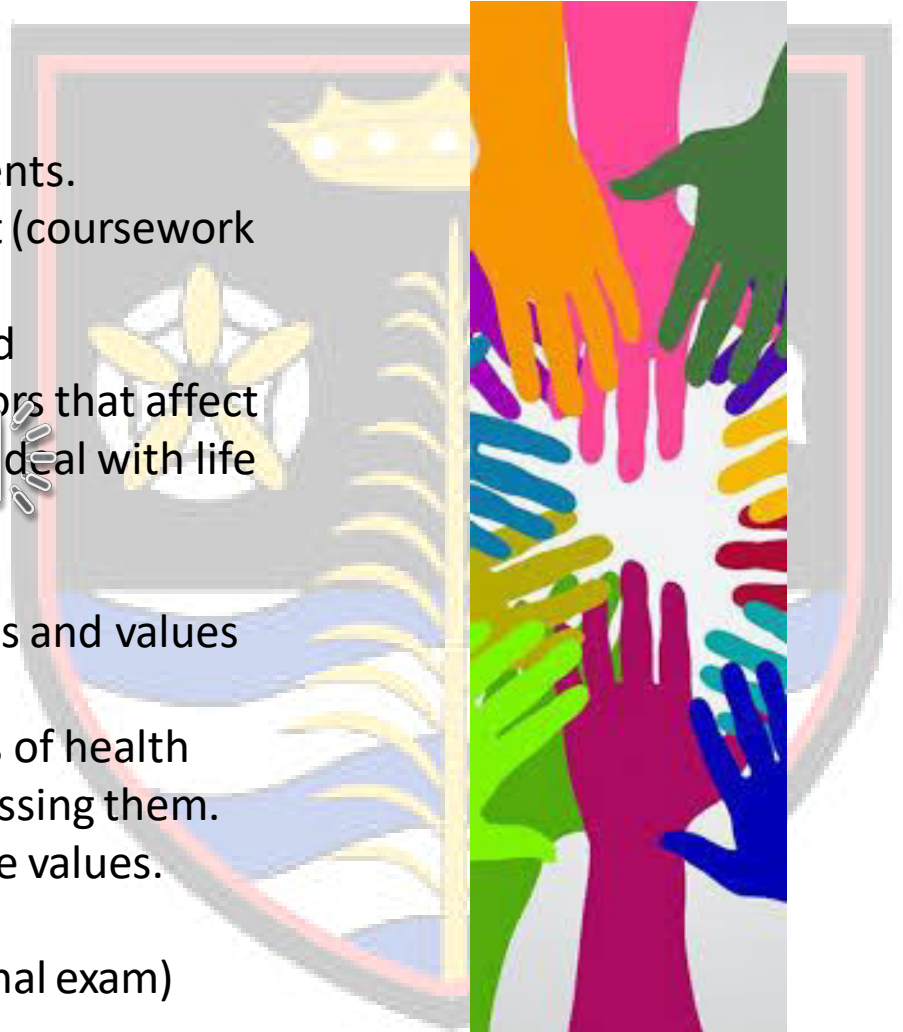
Students will understand the different types of health and social care services and barriers to accessing them.
