





The understanding and appreciation of other cultures and life styles enables our students to develop their tolerance, understanding and awareness of others.


Spiritual excellence is developed through the study and understanding of how important festivals and religious occasions are celebrated in francophone countries throughout the world.


Social excellence is developed by providing opportunities to explore other cultures and to learn together about francophone cultures on 5 continents.

Which language should my child choose?

- Linguistic researchers agree that the single most powerful factor in determining success at learning a foreign language is motivation.
