Year 7

In year 7 pupils will learn the key techniques and features of music and drama. How this can be built into performances, the devising/composing of own pieces and the ability to appraise professional performances.

Year 8

In year 8 pupils build on their knowledge from year 7 by adding more complex techniques and performance skills in both music and drama.

Units studied in year 8:

Drama

- Melodrama and Pantomime
- War Horse
- Soap Operas

Music

- Jazz and Blues
- Horror Music
- World Music Gamelan

Year 9

For 2021/22 year 9 will be studying the same as year 8, this is because they did not study either music or drama in year 7 and therefore have gaps in knowledge. Completing the year 8 units will further support their development of skills and understanding.

Assessments

Pupils have music and drama once per fortnight, meaning a 6-week scheme of work lasts per term. Pupils will therefore have a formal assessment at the end of each term. Pupils complete a self or peer assessment each lesson. Lessons also comprise of verbal feedback throughout to support ongoing progress.
