




Attendance – Mrs Rowe

On 20th May we welcomed four visitors to the school from Ethiopia. Ann and Frank Rispin, who have founded 4 International Schools across the country, were accompanied by Ato Geremew, the General Manager of the British International School in Addis Ababa and Dr Tedros, formerly of the Ethiopian Ministry of Education.



They were on a fact-finding mission and wanted to see what a typical Secondary School in the UK was like. They were incredibly impressed with the school, the quality of resources that they saw, the standard of teacher training in the UK and the high quality of the professional practices employed by the school. Of course, it is a different world in Africa, particularly in Ethiopia where a vicious civil war is still being fought between the Government and the ethnic Tigrayan people in the north of the country and where the ever-present issue of food insecurity is once again becoming a serious threat.

The visit was arranged by Mr Turner, our Geography teacher, who taught in Asia, the Middle East, and in Ethiopia for 3 years, before returning to the UK with his family.

Celebrating Excellent Homework – Drama

In the clip, the Sergeant Major was rallying up his troops and giving them confidence as they sang leading into battle. They passed fellow evacuees along the way and Sergeant Major had a sudden flood of doubt as he saw all of the evacuating men. As Sergeant led his men into the trenches, one of his soldiers threw up as he wasn't so confident as everyone else. Sergeant's men charged towards the German trenches. Many men had fallen before they raided the trenches but, ultimately, they had the winning hand and they stormed the German trenches, killing everyone in their path. People had been left on the battlefield as they had been shell-shocked but some people managed to carry remaining soldiers into their trenches.

The music adds tension and sorrow to the scene as it highlights the scariness and bravery soldiers had to endure during WW1. Also, it tries to emphasise the importance of the battles in WW1 had on history and today's knowledge and technology as people put their lives on the line to change the future of History for the greater good.

The facial expressions of the soldiers show waves of bravery as they leave the army camp and then the tension of realising the importance and death enhancing battle they are about to endure. As one young and worried soldier throws up before the battle he is comforted by the warm reassurance of his Sergeant Major. Then the desperation to live as they charged into the battle and the shell-shocked soldiers who are confused and in a state of traumatisation in the middle of the battlefield.
