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Headteacher's Introduction



As Assistant Headteacher, I have different roles linked to the support and wellbeing of students. I lead the Learning Support team to ensure all students with additional needs have the right support through interventions, reasonable adjustments and in lessons assistance, thus ensuring that all students regardless of need have access to a fully inclusive and high-quality education. We are also able to support students where further investigation or diagnosis is required, as well as working with external agencies.

At BRS we value the need to ensure that all students have access to emotional wellbeing support, as both part of their daily curriculum but also as additional support where needed. As part of my role, I work with the pastoral, teaching assistant and support teams to ensure that all students have access to a termly wellbeing conversation, as well as more in depth 6-week programmes of emotional wellbeing and mental health support. We are also lucky to work alongside the Mental Health Support Team for Schools which allows us to access external mental health support when required.

Along with my SEN and Wellbeing roles, I am also the Safeguarding Lead for the school. This comprises of ensuring that students are safeguarded throughout their time with us. The Safeguarding team support a number of students and families who require a range of different interventions, including support from external agencies.


