In Art lessons Year 7 students have been exploring the 2014 installation *Blood Swept Lands and Seas of Red*, displayed at the Tower of London to commemorate the centenary of WWI. Artists Paul Cummins and Tom Piper created 888,246 ceramic poppies, each poppy to represent British or colonial fatality during the war. Each Year 7 student created their own clay poppy, which was then displayed at Stanton Manor Care Home for residents and visitors. Not only a beautiful display of their hard work, but also a powerful visual commemoration.
