Students have been given a fantastic opportunity to perfect the art of leadership. Mr Heath spoke to pupils a few weeks ago during assembly about the importance of taking themselves out of their comfort zone. Upon completion of two sessions that have been designed to equip students with the theoretical knowledge underpinning key leadership concepts, students apply to become a leader within the categories of Social, Spiritual and Academic. Leadership opportunities include Buddies, Sports Ambassadors, Prefects, Sustainability leaders, Faith in Action, Well-being Leaders, Anti-Bullying ambassadors, Student Council, Pupil Parliament And Literacy leaders. If successful in their application pupils complete a portfolio of evidence that at the end of the academic year will see them gain a SSAT bronze, silver or gold accreditation.



Climate change and environmental issues are huge in the news.

Here at BRS we want to make a difference to the planet too. Notice our Green spaces looking a little more interesting. Sign up for our Green Ambassedors and Gardening Clubs or just come and see me Mrs McAulay or Mrs Smith if you want to help out in any way.

Careers involving this type of work may include:

Arborist (trees), Landscaper and gardener, horticulturist, florist, animal care, zoo keeper, bee keeper, entomologist (insects) marine biologist, vet, conservationist, geologist, oceanographer, farmer, park ranger, fisheries, environmentalist, ornithologist (birds) vineyard manager, turf and greenkeeper.

Look on the National careers service to find out further information.

Highlight jobs – Oceanographer Go with the flow when you dive into deep sea expeditions to study marine ecosystems. Explore the underwater geological formations associated with plate tectonics and discover the secret lives of the sea creatures who live there. Oceanographers are also concerned about the effects of pollution on the sea and its inhabitants, so they dedicate their lives to going deep on the subject of ocean conservation.
