Cashless Catering (Mrs Mills)

New Year 7 parents will receive their ParentPay login details before the end of term. Fingerprints will be taken for all new students on the first day in school in September.

Attendance (Mrs Rowe)

We are excited to announce that school is raising its expectations on attendance to 100%, a significant increase from the previous 97%.



From September we will be implementing an additional function on Class Charts which allows parents to conveniently report absences through the Class Charts app—more information about how this can be done will be shared in September. All reported absences will receive a follow-up phone call to ensure the safety, wellbeing and support of our students.

To reinforce the importance of regular attendance, we will be making alterations to the attendance policy, authorising only up to 5 days of absence (cumulatively) without medical evidence. Please note that holding fining, as mandated by the government, will continue. We want to emphasise that we will not be granting leave of absence retrospectively; a formal absence request form must be completed and approved by the Headteacher—leave will be granted for extenuating circumstances.

As part of our commitment to improving attendance, we have been assigned additional Education Welfare (EW) support, aimed at assisting persistently absent students and addressing those who are frequently late to school. The EWOs, who carry legal weight in matters of school attendance, play a crucial role in ensuring families receive the necessary support.

We urge all parents and students to understand the utmost importance of regular school attendance, in ensuring academic progress and success for all. Together, we can create a thriving educational community.

As we come to the end of this academic year, I would like to extend a heartfelt thank you to all our students and parents who have consistently ensured timely school attendance throughout the last 12 months. Your commitment to regular attendance has undoubtedly contributed to the success and growth of your child.

In the DT and Food Classroom

What an amazing year it has been in school and the work that has been produced in DT and Food has been fantastic! Well done to all our students for their hard work and creative thinking.

This month has seen the Mock practical day for the Year 10 Food students who produced a range challenging dishes demonstrating high skills and planning. Here is a flavour of some of the dishes that were made over the 2 days!



Y10 Skills Mock

The Year 10 DT pupils we set a skills test. This was a set timed task in which they needed to perform standard manufacturing tasks of measuring and fabricating. Quality control measures were applied throughout. They also had to think on their feet for the structural centre piece. This was designed 'on the hoof', which is called iterative design. They needed to think about what materials would be the most appropriate and these ranged from standard hand tools and skills through to CAD and use of the laser cutter. Finally, they needed to present their products to a shop quality.





Y9 Jewellery Boxes



The Y9 pupils have constructed their jewellery boxes from a sustainable wood. They have developed their understanding in this area.

The jewellery boxes have then been personalised for their client or target markets, who they have based the design around.







In the MFL Classroom

Next year We will be running MFL challenges each term for you to get involved in. We will be running an MFL challenge over the summer to give you a little taste of this if you would like to get involved.

The challenge is simple - Do/Make something to do with French/Spanish to bring to show your teacher after the summer.
